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Project Report

We held a comprehensive study class on the two themes of “disaster prevention / mitigation” and “career” for children of the Brazilian school HIRO Gakuen.

We created opportunities for foreigners to play an active role. You Have to Protect by Yourself Your Own Life!

Earthquake Countermeasures Course October 25th (Monday)

"Do you know why a big earthquake happens?"

"Do you know what to do to save your life,
when an earthquake strikes? "

Mr. Ito from the Disaster Prevention Division of the Prefectural Office explained for students in the second and third grades of senior high school, "Due to the damage caused by the big earthquake in Gifu prefecture a long time ago, I learned how an earthquake occurs and the preparations needed to protect myself and my family in case of an earthquake.



Flood damage countermeasure course October 29th (Friday)

Children in the second and third grades of elementary school participated.

Using a debris flow model, Mr. Nomura from the civil engineering office of the prefectural office taught that if it rains a lot, mountains will collapse, the water of the river overflows and the house will be destroyed, so it is very dangerous even if you are far away. He taught also that it is important to check what is happening in the rain and rivers on TV and the Internet to protect your own life, by knowing dangerous places, finding out where to evacuate and how to get there in advance.



Know a lot of information when going to school or getting a job!

For junior and senior high school students, have you ever wondered what you want to do after graduating from school? Do you have a job or dream you would like to have in the future?

When thinking about the future, it is important to know a lot of information about going on to school and getting a job as soon as possible.

Work experience at the Prefectural International Takumi Academy Thursday, November 11th (Thursday)

Students in the second year of senior high school visited the production engineering department of the vocational ability development junior college. It was an opportunity to learn about the work content and attractiveness of many manufacturing industries in the prefecture, through the manufacturing experience, in addition to expanding the range of career paths and occupation choices after graduation.



Lecture by a foreign senior November 24th(Wednesday)

Mr. Leonardo Miyamoto, an international exchange member from Brazil, talked to students in the third year of junior high school about his career based on his own experiences.

Leonardo, who has experience in elementary and junior high schools in Brazil and Japan taught what kind of influence did the different cultures and culture shocks he experienced so far, he also mentioned the need to learn Portuguese and Japanese, and gave some advice to think about the future.



You Can Use "My Number Card" as a Health Insurance Card!

You need to switch your health insurance card when you change jobs or retire, but if you apply in advance on the "Maina Portal", you will be able to use your My Number Card as a health insurance card for a long time. However, one important point is you will still need to submit a notification such as joining health insurance.

Merits of using my number card as health insurance card!

- ① Useful for your own health management!
 - Since you can browse the results of specific medical examinations and the information of the prescribed medicine, you can get a better medical care after seeing the examination data and getting prescriptions for medicines.
- ② No need for a limit application certificate!
 - If you have to pay a large amount for hospitalization, surgery, etc. , even without the certificate of application of the limit, you can reduce medical expenses.
- ③ Once you apply, you can use it as a health insurance card for a long time!
 - Even if your address or place of employment changes, you can receive a medical examination without waiting for the change of your health insurance card.

Available medical institutions, etc.

You can use it at the medical institutions and pharmacies that have "Maina Reception" stickers and posters. Available medical institutions and pharmacies that can be used are open to the public even on the website of the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare.

Mental consultation

We offer mental counselling at the Gifu International Exchange Center, where foreign residents can consult with a professional counselor about their mental problems.

Are you worried about your workplace, family, or other related human relationships ... are you feeling depressed... or are you worried about your own mental health, or the mental health of your family? Please contact our center for the details such as the implementation schedule.

Let's continue to do the basic measures of corona infection control!

- Take the following measures even if you have been vaccinated since breakthrough cases may still occur.

- ▶ Wearing a mask (non-woven mask that fits tightly, there should be no gaps between it and your face)
- ▶ Maintaining hand hygiene (washing hands, disinfecting hands frequently)
- ▶ Avoiding the "Three Cs": Closed spaces, Crowded places, Closed contact setting (avoiding even one could lower the risks)
- ▶ Ventilating indoor spaces frequently
- ▶ Taking good care of your health (if you feel unwell, do not go to work, to school, or to other places)

- Avoid 5 high-risk situations indicated below:

- ▶ Social gatherings that include alcohol consumption (decreased attention leads to louder talking)
- ▶ Groups of people eating and drinking over a long period (such as barhopping to second bar, third bar, ...)
- ▶ Conversing without a mask (be extra careful when going places in a car or on a bus)
- ▶ Multiple people sharing a confined space (common spaces such as dormitory room or toilet)
- ▶ Changes in environment (take care not to lower your guard when moving from the office to the break rooms, smoking areas, dressing rooms)

- Strictly follow basic infection prevention measures when coming home, traveling to other cities or prefectures. Especially, avoid traveling to and from areas that currently have a high infection rate.
- Only go to buildings or use facilities that strictly follow guidelines as specified for such places.
- Take infection prevention measures when coming home from a far place or when traveling. Get tested for covid before departure or after arrival.
- In an effort to help protect children under 12 (who are not eligible for covid-19 vaccines) and their families, it is recommended that the adults in the family be vaccinated and that all should take preventive measures such as frequent hand washing.
